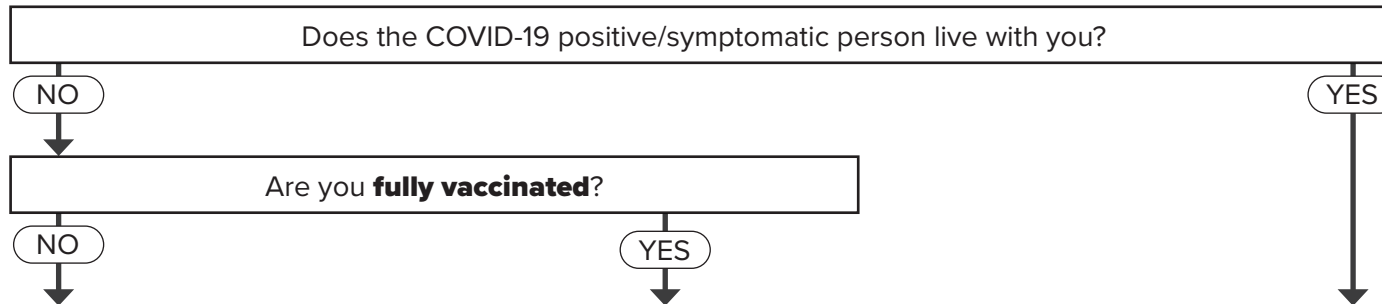


# You've been identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or someone with COVID-19 symptoms and you work in a **highest risk setting**.<sup>\*</sup> Now what?



- **Self-isolate** immediately for 10 days from your last exposure, unless you have previously tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 90 days.
- If you develop any **symptoms**, get tested as soon as possible and **self-isolate** until you get your result.
- Notify your employer and follow any work restrictions.

- **Self-monitor** for symptoms for 10 days.\*\*
- Get tested if recommended by the public health unit. If your test is positive you must self-isolate. Follow the guidance for cases.
- You should NOT attend work for 10 days from your last exposure.
- Report your exposure to your employer and follow any work restrictions. If there is a critical staff shortage, you may be able to attend work under work-self isolation.
- If you develop any **symptoms**, get tested as soon as possible and **self-isolate** until you get your result.

- **Self-isolate** for the same amount of time as the positive/symptomatic person.\*\*
- You should **NOT** attend work for 10 days from your last exposure.
- Notify your employer and follow any work restrictions. If there is a critical staff shortage, you may be able to attend work under work-self isolation.
- If you have previously tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days, you do not need to isolate and can attend work.
- If you develop **symptoms**, get tested and follow the **guidance for cases**.

<sup>\*</sup>Highest risk settings include hospitals (including complex continuing care facilities and paramedic services) and congregate living settings, including Long-Term Care, retirement homes, First Nation elder care lodges, group homes, shelters, hospices, and correctional institutions.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Wear a well-fitted mask in public, physical distance and maintain other public health measures for 10 days following your last exposure. You should **NOT** visit any highest risk settings<sup>\*</sup> or individuals who may be at higher risk of illness for 10 days from your last exposure, unless you recently had test-confirmed COVID-19 infection.

**Immunocompromised individuals may still be susceptible regardless of vaccination and should self-isolate for 10 days after last exposure to a case/symptomatic person.**
